The Sunday after Thanksgiving is the first Sunday of Advent (and we are Hanging the Greens that Sunday, hint, hint).

Advent is a time of preparation and anticipation for the birth of Christ. I sometimes find this confusing, because, of course, Jesus was born over two-thousand years ago and it feels like we may procrastinated preparing for his arrival just a bit too long.

But serving here helps me understand it better. Thank you First Christian, you keep teaching me by sharing your life with me.

Though Christ has come and we know salvation and grace, there continues to be evil, cruelty, violence, reason for sadness, and temptation to despair. Our Holy Seasons, Advent to Christmas and Lent to Easter, are responses to bolster our hope. They are constructed to help us build up energy and excitement for the faith we practice year round and the God who is always with us.

At the same time, as many of us feel hope and joy growing, others feel the pain of isolation and hunger more acutely. This is not just a problem for the impoverished, the physically hungry, the literally alone, the orphaned, and the widowed. Scarcity hits us all in the anxiety bits and pieces. Instinctively as the cold comes we begin to hoard our resources, circle the wagons, and begin to draw fresh lines between "us"s and "them"s in our hearts.

Those who are literally and physically in need may not be the only ones under attack from the not-enoughs and the me-or-thems, but they might be our best salvation from them. More than they need our charity at this time of year, we need to give, to open ourselves, and to embody a God who willingly breaks through into a hostile and uncertain world.

Without expecting gratitude, I encourage you to make this season about giving rather than the Black-Friday-competitions and status wars. Sparkly decorations are good things as long as we remember what we are trying to draw attention to and don't get caught in the human temptation to focus on the tinsel alone.

Merry Christmas to all followers of Christ and Happy Holidays to ALL our other sisters and brothers- Seth



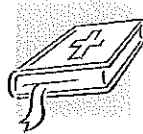

Sharing Our Giving

When we talk about Stewardship we talk a lot about giving. We talk about the financial needs of the congregation's staff and facilities. We talk about the outreach and mission work that we support and the lives that are changed as a result. I talk, most weeks (to one extent or another), about the great value of both monetary and non-monetary gifts (time, attention, skill, prayer, compassion, labor).

And the part of Stewardship that we maybe don't discuss enough: celebrating the acts of giving.

It is not enough to give; we need to claim that giving.

This is not about bragging or comparing gifts.

This is about owning that we make serving God, often through serving FCC, a priority in our lives and setting an example.

If we do not name it and claim it then others find what our service and sacrifices too easy to dismiss. It needs to be celebrated as gifts received from and willingly given back to God.

To that end, in December you will begin to see new pieces of differently colored paper in the pews. These purple forms will offer the opportunity for folks to write down the ways they are giving to God, and to FCC, during the past week. You will have a choice about whether or not to write your name.

When you see them, I encourage each person, young and old, to fill one out. FCC not only has but gives and shares so many gifts. I want your children and the community of Paulding to be more aware of that and this is a way to start.

Gift-giving Solutions

Trying to find fits for certain people-or letting others know what you want-can be quite challenging. After all, most of us don't need anything.

Realizing that the best gifts aren't material items offers a new perspective on giving and receiving. Consider these in sights from author Charles Swindoll:

"Some gifts you can give this Christmas are beyond monetary value: Mend a quarrel, dismiss suspicion, tell someone "I love you." Give something away-anonymously. Forgive someone who has treated you wrong. Turn away wrath with a soft answer. Visit someone in a nursing home. Apologize if you were wrong. Be especially kind to someone with whom you work. Give as God gave to you in Christ, without obligation, or announcement, or reservation, or hypocrisy."



Where's your security?

When A Charlie Brown Christmas debuted in 1965, religious references were unheard of on television. Yet the show's climax features the Christmas story verbatim. As Linus begins reciting Luke 2, he's clutching his ever-present blue blanket. Yet, as Pastor Jason Soroski points out, Linus drops it right as he utters the words "fear not" (Luke 2:10).

"Soroski believes the timing is intentional and that "Peanuts" creator Charles M. Schulz sends a simple, brilliant message. "The birth of Jesus separates us from our fears, " Soroski writes, It "frees us from the habits we are unable (or unwilling) to break ourselves. The birth of Jesus allows us to simply drop the false security we have been grasping so tightly, and learn to trust and cling to him instead."

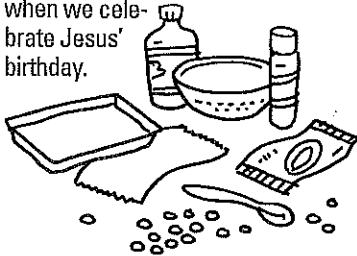

Make this yummy treat to give to family and friends at Christmas, when we celebrate Jesus' birthday.

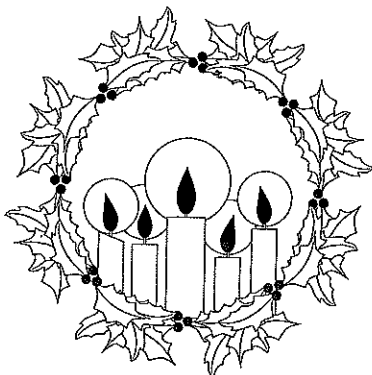


What you need:

- Nonstick cooking spray
- 3 cups chocolate chips
- Microwave-safe bowl
- Spoon or spatula
- 2 Tbsp. shortening
- Baking tray lined with wax paper
- Red and green M&M's (or sprinkles)

What you do:

1. Lightly spray bowl and wax paper.
2. Microwave chocolate chips in bowl for one-minute intervals until chocolate is melted. (Stir after each minute.)
3. Stir in shortening. Heat in 10-second intervals, stirring until smooth.
4. Pour chocolate onto tray and firmly press in M&M's or sprinkles.
5. Refrigerate until firm. Remove bark and break into pieces.
