MISSION OF FIRST CHRISTIAN CHURCH

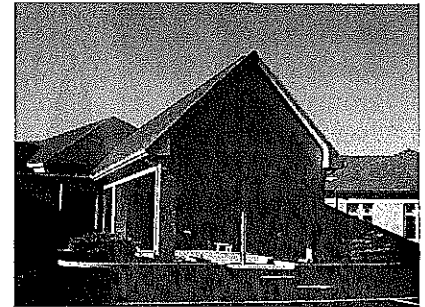
The mission of this Congregation shall be—

Over the past year the Pastor Search Committee interviewed several potential candidates, and then we received the profile for Rev. Merlyn Winters. We talked with her on the phone and then meet with her here at the church. She answered all our questions, and we answered all of hers. The Board voted to bring her to the congregation, and on Sunday, January 8, the congregation voted to call her to the First Christian Church of Paulding as our new Pastor.

Our goal was not to find the first one available, but to find one that God was making ready to serve us, lead us, and help us grow, as we proceed into the future. 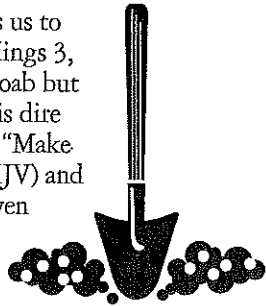

Extravagant love

The love St. Paul describes in 1 Corinthians 13 is "no mild, tepid thing," writes Mark Buchanan in *Your Church Is Too Safe* (Zondervan). "It is no flight of fancy, no frisson of giddiness, no mere ruffle of sensation. This love is neither nice nor prissy nor fragile nor coy. This love is fierce and wild and dangerous and unbreakable. It is sublime and subversive. It is indefatigable and undefeatable. It is nothing less than the love God has for you, to bind you and to loose you, to take you captive and then set you free. This love is extravagant."

In all his glory

On the Sunday before Ash Wednesday, many Christian churches celebrate the Transfiguration of Our Lord. After telling his shocked, uncomprehending disciples that he would die and rise again, Jesus took Peter, James and John up a mountain. Suddenly Jesus appeared to be glowing! "He was transfigured before them, and his face shone like the sun, and his clothes became white as light" (Matthew 17:2, BSV).

Moses and Elijah appeared, and a voice said, "This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased; listen to him" (verse 5). Jesus' disciples fell to the ground, overcome by fear. But Jesus touched them, told them not to be afraid and led them down the mountain.

The disciples witnessed firsthand the glory and Godhood of Jesus, who would soon die for the sins of the world and rise again to give us life.

You are cherished

We must understand that God does not "love" us without liking us — through gritted teeth — as "Christian" love is sometimes thought to do. Rather, out of the eternal freshness of his perpetually self-renewed being, the heavenly Father cherishes the earth and each human being upon it. The fondness, the endearment, the unstintingly affectionate regard of God toward all his creatures is the natural outflow of what he is to the core — which we vainly try to capture with our tired but indispensable old word "love."

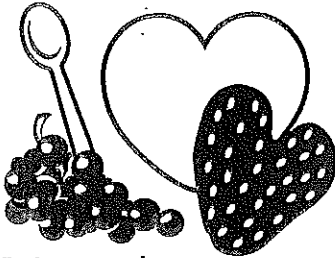

Heart FRUIT SALAD

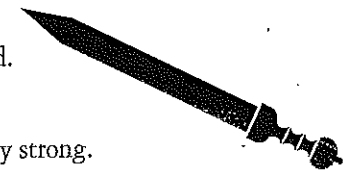
